#### PANTONE 13-1023 Peach Fuzz breeds 'nurturing, empathy and compassion,' the company says

The color of the new year is just peachy. Pantone has officially crowned PANTONE 13-1023 Peach Fuzz as its 2024 Color of the Year. In a press release, the color brand described the

shade of choice as a "velvety gentle peach whose

all-embracing spirit enriches mind, body

and soul."

Pantone addressed that during a "time of turmoil in many aspects of our lives," the need for "nurturing, empathy and compassion grows ever stronger, as does our imaginings of a more peaceful future."

Pantone Color Institute's executive director Leatrice Eiseman commented in a statement that the "cozy peach hue" softly nestled between pink and orange" conjures up an "air of calm." She added that the color offers "a space to be, feel and heal and to flourish ... whether spending time with others or taking the time to enjoy a moment by ourselves."

"Drawing comfort from PANTONE 13-1023 Peach Fuzz, we can find peace from within, impacting our well-being," Eiseman went on.

This year marks the 25th anniversary of the Pantone Color of the Year program. The program was first introduced in 1999 with PANTONE 15-4020 Cerulean Blue.

Each year's selection serves as "an expression of a mood and an attitude on the part of the

consumer," according to the company.

"Through the years, the Pantone Color of the Year program has become a globally iconic cultural touchstone, drawing attention to how what is taking place in our global culture is reflected and expressed through the language of color," Pantone noted.

"In the spirit of PANTONE 13-1023 Peach Fuzz, we reflect back on the last 25 years of the Pantone Color of the Year program, grateful to provide an avenue where designers and color enthusiasts all over the world can engage in a conversation about color, be inspired by color and showcase their creativity within their communities," said Pressman.

#### **Beat the Winter Blues**


Fewer hours of sunlight during the winter days certainly plays with our moods. Here are a few things you can do to keep the blues at bay:
